

I have teammates with cerebral palsy, scoliosis, and who are wheelchair bound. You don't have to be the best to compete, nor do you have to win to be considered a winner. Everyone



comes to practice with personal goals and strives to achieve them.

I was born with bilateral hip dysplasia, which rendered me immobile for the first eight months and at 4 years, I had to attend physical therapy for Gross Motor Delay. Coming from a background of physical handicaps, I respect and accept athletes that embrace training and competition no matter their circumstance.

Athletics helped me form friendships and find my niche in a new town when I moved here in 6th grade, a time where breaking into a friend group was difficult. In seventh grade, I had the opportunity

to join and actually compete on the varsity cross country team. Thanks to the wonderful upperclasswomen, little thirteen year old me felt accepted and encouraged to do my best. I began to realize that I had a talent for running, and my coaches and teammates supported my hard work.

I enjoyed skiing recreationally, and when I learned that we had an alpine ski team, I took advantage of the opportunity to explore this sport. I started ski racing later than most people, but my teammates were patient with me, and wanted to see me succeed. By the end of my skiing career, I was the second fastest skier on the team, and took on the leadership role of mentoring and encouraging new skiers just as my teammates had shown me when I was a beginner.

For me, nothing beats the adrenaline rush of standing on the starting line, or stomping your skis out in the starting gate, just before the timer starts. Getting out there and competing is a feeling like no other and I will never take that feeling for granted. My sophomore track season and goals ground to a halt when COVID-19 forced my school to move to distant learning and the track season was canceled. I turned this adversity into an opportunity by running 650 miles between April and September of 2020. High school athletics gifted me with lifelong skills, friendships, and memories. I attribute my success to the multitude of people that helped me as I explored and made the most of all the opportunities afforded to me.



Mark Schuck, Nicollet



Mark Schuck graduated from Nicollet High School in 1965 and was a member of the Football, Basketball and Track teams. He set the school record and still holds it in the Pole Vault at 13 feet, which tied for second place in the state championship. He was the first athlete in the history of Nicollet to place in a state athletic contest. The football team was undefeated his junior and senior years. The basketball team was very successful as well, advancing to district runner-up for two years in a

row in a one-class system. In his senior year, the Nicollet High School Basketball team was undefeated going into tournament play. Throughout his high school career, he was fortunate to have outstanding coaches, including Don Olson, Fran Braunger, Duane Freund, Doug Jensen, and Darryl Miller, as well as outstanding teammates! His coaches were not only talented as coaches, but great mentors, teachers, and role models.

Mark went onto Mankato State College following high school and competed in cross country, basketball, and track and field before graduating in 1969. His first eight years of teaching were at Wilson Campus Lab School in Mankato where he taught Physical Education to three-year-olds through seniors. He was Athletic Director, Head Cross Country Coach, Assistant Basketball Coach to Gene Biewen, and Head Track and Field Coach for eight years. He was fortunate to work with outstanding athletes and faculty members.

He moved to Minnesota State University in 1976 and worked there until 2013. He was Assistant Track and Field Coach to Chuck Petersen, and he went on to become the Head Track Coach from 1998 to 2013 and Head Cross Country Coach from 1979 to 2012. Under his 34-year tenure as head cross country coach, Schuck's


teams won nine North Central Conference Cross Country titles. He held many Cross Country Coach of the Year titles, and Schuck was named the North Central Regional Men's Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1999. Schuck led the Mavericks to their first-ever NCAA Division II cross country title in 1988. Under Schuck the Mavericks have made 25 appearances at the NCAA cross country meets and have posted 16 top ten finishes.

In track and field, he has had four national individual champions during his tenure. He was NCC Indoor Coach of the Year in 2004, 2006 and 2008, and NSIC Coach of the Year in 2009, 2010 and 2012. Also in 2006, 2009 and 2010, he was selected as the North Central Regional Indoor Men's Track and Field Coach of the Year. He is also a four-time league Outdoor Track and Field Coach of the Year (2008 in the NCC, 2009, 2010 and 2012 in the NSIC). His indoor track & field team finished second in the nation in 1989.

Schuck is a two-time national coach of the year which was included the 2006 USTFCCCA NCAA Division II Men's Indoor Track Coach of the Year and 1988 NCAA DII Men's Cross Country Coach of the Year. During those years at MSU he also served as the Student Relations Coordinator for the College of Allied Health, taught Phy. Ed. courses, and the Intro to Physical Therapy course. He was also served as Minnesota State Interim Athletic Director twice. He was very proud of being the MSU representative in organizing the indoor high school track meets and the high school basketball tournaments for many years.

Dan Johnson, Hopkins



I grew up in Aberdeen, South Dakota and played baseball, basketball and football through high school at Central High in Aberdeen. I started my college baseball career at Indian Hills in Centerville, Iowa and then finished at Northern State University in South Dakota as an honorable mention All-American. I completed my bachelor's degree in education in 1984 and moved to Texas with my wife, Lynne and infant son, Bryan. My first stop was in Mabank, Texas where I was the head baseball coach and assistant football coach. After two years in a mid-size high school, I realized that I wanted to be a college baseball coach and that I needed more education to make that happen, so

I loaded up my family, which now included our daughter, Emily, and we moved back to South Dakota. I was a graduate assistant at Northern in both football and baseball while completing my master's degree in education.

In 1987, we moved back to Texas and I was the head baseball coach and assistant football coach in Ranger, Texas. A year later, I became the head football coach. A few months after that, I became the athletic director and things started to move pretty fast. To say I was ready to take on those roles would be a lie but I really thought I was. My first year as head football coach, we made it to the playoffs (only the top 2 schools in each district make the playoffs in Texas), and that was the first time a Ranger team had made the playoffs since the '50's.

In January of 1991, I was offered what I thought was my career move – a head baseball coaching position in a college! Peru State College of Nebraska offered me the job and I took it. I wasn't really interested but it paid a little more money and less teaching responsibility, so I accepted. We stayed in Nebraska for 5 years. In February of 1996, we came to Hopkins, Minnesota as the facility manager and head baseball coach. I loved that job and was very happy coaching baseball and not being the AD. In 1999...I became the District Director of Student Activities for Hopkins Public Schools. I have truly enjoyed my time in this position and I am so fortunate to have worked with some outstanding coaches, administrators, AD's, athletes, and all of the various populations you come in contact with in these jobs.

I will be retiring at the end of this current school year and will become the executive director of the MNIAAA as of July 1, which I am looking forward to very much!



2022 HALL OF FAME

Doug Darnell, Brooklyn Center



Doug Darnell is a graduate of the University of Northern Iowa, earning both a bachelor and masters degree in Physical Education while participating in both football and baseball. Shortly after graduation, he was hired at Brooklyn Center in the fall of 1969. Doug and his wife Karla lived two blocks from Brooklyn Center High School for 42 years and their three sons attended Brooklyn Center High School.

Doug taught 24 years in Physical Education and coached baseball for 24 years in addition

to coaching football, junior high wrestling, basketball, coordinating the strength and conditioning program, taught drivers education, and coached legion baseball just to name a few things he did. He coaches in the Minnesota State High School Baseball Coaches Association all star game twice and the Minnesota State Football Coaches Association All Star Game once. He became the Activities Director in 1993 at Brooklyn Center. This was a new position at Brooklyn Center, encompassing the fine arts and music to the position. In 1994, the superintendent asked Doug to get his Community Education licenses. He assumed the position of Community Education Director in addition to being the Activities Director until he retired in 2003. In "retirement", he served as the Tri-Metro Conference Executive Secretary until 2021.

Doug was a tireless worker at both the Region and State levels. He has served the Region as a subsection coordinator and ran many section tournaments. He has served on several MSHSL committees including the committee to recognize dance as an activity governed by the MSHSL. Doug has earned countless awards from the section and state for his coaching, including being inducted into the Minnesota State Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame and having the baseball field at Brooklyn Center named Doug Darnell Field.

A colleague of Doug's wrote a letter of recommendation which stated "Doug has never sought recognition. Rather, recognition has reached for him because of his multifaceted accomplishments, his love of all activities, and his passion to provide endless opportunities for all students and adults. Doug was the heart of all activities at Brooklyn Center High School and his hand touches every aspect of the Centaurs athletic, fine arts, and community programs".







Keith "Swanny" Swanson first started teaching in 1972 at St. Raphael's School in Springfield MN. But it would be in 1974 that he would move to Hoffman MN and start a long, incredible career in the West Central Area.

He spent a career in Education working as a teacher and coach. Keith coaches football, basketball, track and golf from 1974 to 2008. During that time, he was Head Coach of Football for 27 years, had a 174-78 record, won 11 conference championships,

7 section titles, and 2 State Championships. Named Conference Coach of the year 13 times, section coach of the year 5 times, and State Coach of the Year 2 times. Twice he served as President of the Minnesota Football Coaches Association, and was inducted into the Minnesota Football Coaches Hall of Fame in 2002. He was also inducted into the West Central Area Hall of Fame in 2004.

Swanny has served the MNIAAA as a member for over 30 years, attending nearly all of the State Conferences and serving as a moderator and facilitator. He has served as a Sub Section Representative to the MSHSCA, a member of the Excel Selection Committee, a member of the MSHSL Hall of Fame Committee, and a member of the NIAAA. Further, he was a football official for 93 regular season games, 19 section playoff games, 6 state playoff games and 1 state final.

His commitment to his community is well documented and noted. From serving on the Hoffman City Council, Grant County Commissioner, the Hoffman Chamber of Commerce President, and the Hoffman Lions Club President.

A colleague of Swann's wrote a letter of recommendation which stated "Keith's legacy is a tribute to all things that are important in education and life. His strong leadership skills, his positive attitude, treating student athletes and peers with respect, taking care of family and being a role model that all of us can look up to."







Rita Rislund grew up in Detroit Lakes, the 2nd youngest of 10 children of Theodore and Rosella Huebner. Rita graduated from Detroit Lakes High School in 1962. This was long before TITLE IX. The only competitive activity at the time was cheerleading and one night a week (for an hour or two) in the gym playing basketball.

College saw another professional step in ensuring her and other females had the opportunity to

pursue athletic participation. Moorhead State College (now MSUM) formed a conference for their female students to have athletic success. Rita was a part of that opportunity. As a student teacher, Rita started the girls track program at Fargo North High School and took several athletes to the state meet in North Dakota.

Fall of 1968 saw Rita help form a conference in her first and only school, Princeton High School. Five area female P.E. instructors formed a conference to allow for athletic participation in Volleyball, Basketball, and Track. One of her colleagues at Princeton (Connie Weis) was a participant in her years of high school in this program. This, again, is before Title IX.

Since retirement, Rita participates as an official in Volleyball and Track to further promote females in their participation and success in athletics. In 2014 she was recognized as an outstanding official by the Coaches association.

Rita taught and was Activities Director at Princeton High School for 34 years. During her time at Princeton, Rita was a chair of the Rum River Conference, Chair of the 7AA committee, founding member of the "Women in Sports Leadership" at the MSHSL. Rita also served as a member of the Representative Assembly and





Ad Hoc committees on Rules for the MSHSL. Rita ran many tournaments on the conference, Sub-section and Section levels. She has been at the State Track meet for close to 50 years. She was a part of writing the Activities Handbook at Princeton High School.

Mark is a proud alumni of Breckenridge High School. He has served his school communities as a Track and Football coach at both Herman-Norcross and Morris Area. Mark's leadership is evident by

his involvement in a multitude of avenues. Mark has served the MSHSL and it's membership in multiple capacities, including the MSHSL Region Rep Assembly, the MSHSL Officials Advisory Committee, and serving as a Section Manager for Track and Field. On top of that, he has served students, families, and communities for 35 years as an MSHSL Official.
